Aim's - - - Students Should Know That:

1. It was the women that first saw, reported and told the gospel message about our risen Savior; and this is the foundation of our Christian faith.
2. Jesus followers in their despair forgot, however, Jesus kept his promise to rise from the dead; the resurrection confirms eternal life after death; and we have new hope.
3. We need to remember and respond with belief not unbelief about what Jesus taught, especially when circumstances get tough.

Discussion Topics:

- Why is the resurrection important; how does it assure eternal life for us; and why do we need to establish our own personal relationship with God?
- What is resurrection power and what does it mean for you?
- How can we move away from the Easter Bunny, new clothes, etc., and get back to celebrating the true meaning of Easter?
